

Reverse painted, functional art made with a Jewish flair

Living Art by Leah is hand-painted, functional, Judaic art created out of a desire to honor the beautiful traditions of the Jewish people.

Renowned organizer Hot Works, LLC brings the 22nd Estero Fine Art Show to a new location at JetBlue Park in Fort Myers on January 5 & 6.

All forms of discipline are for sale to the public. There is something for everyone, in all price ranges. The Estero Fine Art Show has been voted among the top 100 art shows in America three years running. It is juried by art professionals with criteria based on originality, appearance, technique/execution and booth appearance. There is \$1,500 in professional artist awards presented on Saturday, January 5 at 3:00 p.m.

One of the artists whose work will be prominently featured is Lori Charnow of Boynton Beach.

Born in Brooklyn, New York, the artist has roots in two distinct Jewish cultures as the daughter of first-generation Americans whose families immigrated from Russia on her father's side and Turkey on her mother's. As a child, she enjoyed the unique opportunity of experiencing old world Sephardi and Ashkenazi customs firsthand in her

grandparents and great-grandparents homes. This early history gave the artist a great longing to share her cultural roots with her own family and friends and has led her to create unique pieces of art to enhance the rituals of both cultures.
